

APPLYING FOR CERTIFICATION

Certification is open to all practitioners in the contaminated site sector who can fulfil the criteria for certification.

Education. A degree level qualification in a related engineering or science discipline.

Professional practice. A minimum of 5 years practical experience working in a field related to the assessment and remediation of contaminated sites.

Competencies. The demonstration of a set of defined competencies. Applications prepare statements demonstrating their technical knowledge by citing examples of their experience to each of the six key competencies (*1,200-2,000 words per competency*).

Continuing professional development. Commitment to 50 hours per year of professional development activities to maintain current knowledge and competence in the field.

Client reports. At least 2 client reports, which the applicant has written, are required and will be treated as strictly confidential. For non-consultants, other documents can be submitted relevant to the contaminated site sector which demonstrate examples of the applicant's technical knowledge as well as their writing ability.

Referee reports. Are required from 2 referees in support of the application, including at least one referee who is not directly associated with the applicant or their employer. Referees should have direct and recent knowledge of the applicant's activities in site assessment, management and remediation.

Interviews. Some applicants may be asked to attend an interview.

ASSESSMENT PANELS

- Assessment panels are selected from the Assessment subcommittee of SCP Australia.
- All assessors nominated to the assessment subcommittee are accredited environmental auditors/ senior practitioners.
- All assessors sign non-disclosure statements and declare any conflicts of interest.
- Each panel consists of three assessors & recommendations for certification need to be unanimous.
- Regulators are informed of all intending applicants.
- Panels may request an interview.

APPLICATION ROUNDS

- **Round 4.** September 30, 2015 - for certification from October 2015
- **Round 5.** December 31, 2015 - for certification from July 2016
- **Round 6.** June 30, 2016 - for certification January 2017
